Aloha Owners,

In an effort to maximize parking for all Owners and Guests, while accommodating long-term stored vehicles, we would like to reiterate the importance of adhering to the Long-Term Vehicle Storage Policy. The policy was established to manage vehicles being stored on-site by Owners for extended periods of time while Owners are off-site. Having an enforceable policy in place allows on-site staff to manage parking more effectively and efficiently, enabling in-house Owners and Guests the convenience of parking in preferred parking stalls.

Long-Term Vehicle Storage Policy Highlights

- Owners are required to complete and submit to Security a Long-Term Vehicle Storage Policy Agreement with Emergency contact details prior to placing their vehicle into long-term storage. A form can be obtained via the Owner website at <http://kaanapaliwhaler.com/storage/Storage%20Vehicle%20Agreement%20Form.pdf> or the AOA Office.
- A spare key for the stored vehicle must be provided to Security prior to placing the vehicle into long-term storage.
- Vehicles in long-term storage shall be stored in locations designated by the GM and may be moved at the GM discretion as required.
- Owners must give notice to Security prior to leaving the vehicle in long-term storage so that Security is able to track when vehicles are active or inactive.
- Owners who wish to have their vehicles removed from long-term storage prior to their arrival must give Security a minimum of 5 days' notice to allow staff ample time to remove the vehicle prior to Owner arrival.
- Vehicles in long-term storage, abandoned by Owners without completing a Long-Term Vehicle Storage Policy Agreement and failing to provide a spare key to the vehicle may be towed at the Owner's expense.
